

Black Panther: Forgiving Killmonger Lesson

Purpose:

To discuss Black Panther's final scene with Killmonger as an act of

forgiveness in the way that Jesus calls us to do.

Scriptural Examples:

Luke 10:36-37: "The one who showed mercy"

• These verses sum up the lesson from the Parable of the Good Samaritan. Jesus asks which man was the neighbor, to which the lawyer states: "the one who showed mercy." Jesus then says, "Go and do likewise."

Matthew 5:43-45: "Love your enemies"

• Jesus' words on loving our enemies from the Sermon on the Mount

Acts 9:1-6, (7-19): The Road to Damascus

• Paul, though he has persecuted the church, is treated with mercy by Jesus (and Ananias).

Supplies:

+ Computer/Device to Stream (Something else to project to, depending on

group size)

+ Clip from *Black Panther* of Killmonger's Death Scene/ Sunset (if you don't

have a physical copy, you can find the film or clips of it through various

streaming services.)

Note: if you have younger viewers, make sure you get signed permission

from parents. This film has a PG-13 rating.



Procedure:



- 1. If you haven't already in other sessions, go through who Killmonger is in the film and his conflict with Black Panther so far (use the resources on the *Gospel according to Superheroes* website if you need help with this).
- 2. Show the clip of Black Panther and Killmonger looking at the sunset and, if time allows, the fight scene before this.
- 3. Discuss Black Panther taking Killmonger to see the sunset as an act of mercy on Killmonger.
- Also Discuss Black Panther saying, "Maybe we can still heal you." After all that Killmonger has done, Black Panther still shows compassion for him.
- Discuss Black Panther's act of forgiveness as a continuation of his forgiveness of Zemo in *Captain America Civil War* (go to *Gospel according to Superheroes* website to learn more).
- Discuss Black Panther's desire to right the past wrongs of his father and ancestors. Discuss whether this might aid Black Panther in his compassion for Killmonger.
