Here are some questions to help get you started with your discussion.

The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe Chapter 11:

- Why do you think the White Witch has dropped all pretense of liking Edmund?
- The weather, in the past several chapters, has seemed to work to the advantage of all the children, Edmund as well as Peter, Susan, and Lucy. Why do you think that is?
- ❖ What does it mean that Edmund has such a change of heart that "he would have given anything to meet the others at this moment- even Peter!"?
- ❖ The White Witch tells the animals enjoying their feast that she will forgive them if they say they were lying about Father Christmas coming. Why would she want them to lie about this fact? What does that tell us about evil?
- Edmund asks the White Witch not to turn the animals to stone.
 Why?
- ❖ We are told that after the animals are turned to stone, "Edmund, for the first time in this story, felt sorry for someone besides himself."
 Why does he have this continuing change of heart?
- ❖ Why does Edmund's heart leap on realizing the frost is over?





- Why is the White Witch unwilling to receive any news that might be bad for her?
- ❖ What is the power of a name like "Aslan" that elicits such a violent reaction from the White Witch?
