Here are some questions to help get you started with your discussion.

The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe Chapter 13:

- ❖ We are told by the White Witch's dwarf servant that the prophecy of the four children may no longer matter if Aslan has returned. What does that say about Aslan?
- ❖ The White Witch says Aslan might "not stay long." Is this true? Why or why not? How does this influence how we think about God's presence?
- ❖ Why does the White Witch seem to be so focused on the rules?
- ❖ Why is it that we do not get to hear Aslan's conversation with Edmund? What do you think they talked about? Why did Edmund remember this conversation for the rest of his life?
- ❖ Aslan says "there is no need to talk to him about what is past." How is this like the Rite of Reconciliation or Confession?
- ❖ After Aslan says they don't need to talk about the past, Edmund still says "I'm sorry." Why?
- ❖ Discuss the White Witch's invocation of the Deep Magic. Is there anything like it in life or in Scripture that you would compare it to?
- ❖ How is Aslan's unwillingness to work against the Emperor's Magic similar to Jesus fulfilling His Father's will?





- ❖ Why is Edmund the only one able to focus solely on Aslan and not interject?
- ❖ What do you think Aslan offered the White Witch and why?
- ❖ Why doesn't the White Witch realize that Aslan will always keep His word, unlike her?
- ❖ How is Aslan's roar a sign of both His goodness and terribleness that we have about before?
