Here are some questions to help get you started with your discussion.

The Magician's Nephew Chapter 12:

- ❖ When it comes to repentance, as Aslan tells Digory, the key is to be ready to do what it takes to right the wrong. What has been your experience of being ready to repent?
- ❖ What does it mean that Aslan shares Digory's grief?
- Why is it that only Aslan and Digory know that "grief is great" in Narnia yet?
- ❖ Digory finds it wise not to question the possibility of doing what Aslan asks. Compare/contrast Digory's reaction to that of Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist, in Luke 1:1-25, 57-80.
- What is it about Aslan that makes Digory think twice before asking a question or commenting?
- Strawberry in receiving a new purpose and task from Aslan, also gains a new name: Fledge. Compare what happens to Fledge with people who receive new names from God in Scripture.
- Polly and Fledge discuss how Aslan knows all but still likes to be asked for what we need. How is this similar to God's interactions with us?
- Why might God want us to ask questions God already knows the answer to? What does this say about the kind of relationship God





wants to have with us?
