Here are some questions to help get you started with your discussion.

The Magician's Nephew Chapter 6:

- ❖ Jadis is strong everywhere but the Wood Between the Worlds. What does this say about the nature of the Wood Between the Worlds?

 What does is say about the nature of Jadis?
- ❖ Later Jadis doesn't speak about what happened in the Wood Between the Worlds. Are Digory and the narrator correct in suggesting that she cannot remember that place, similar to the forgetfulness Digory and Polly experience while there back in Chapter 3? Is she merely being prideful and not admitting she was ever in a position of weakness?
- Digory hesitates when Jadis asks him for mercy. Are we called to be merciful even to those who act evil?
- ❖ Polly is rightfully still angry at Digory about what happened with the Bell in Chapter 4, but forgives him quickly when she realizes the well-being of another, Digory's mother, is at stake. What does this say about Polly as a person? How can we be more like Polly in our own lives?
